

Andrzej Halicki was born on November 26th, 1961 in Warsaw. He graduated from the Main School of Planning and Statistics (today known as Warsaw School of Economics) from the Department of Internal Trade in the field of economics of air transportation. In the course of his studies in 1986-89, he was a member of the national, underground, intercollegiate authorities of the NZS (the Independent Students Association) and a leader of the NZS at the Main School of Planning and Statistics.

After graduating in 1990-92, he served as spokesman and member of the national board of The Liberal Democratic Congress, inter alia, during the times of the Prime Minister Jan Krzysztof Bielecki. During the first term of Sejm, he was the spokesman of the Parliamentary Club of The Liberal Democratic Congress.

In the early 1990's, Mr. Halicki he was the head of the division of public affairs, then Director of the Polish branch of American agency Burson-Marsteller. In 1993, he served as an advisor to the Minister of Privatization, and a year later, he was spokesman for the Common Privatization Program. He was also a member of the National Council of the Freedom Union.

Since 1996, he was a founder of GGK Public Relations Agency created (acting under the international agency Lowe GGK, belonging to the world's largest advertising network IPG). In 2007, he left the company and become a fulltime Deputy.

Since 2001, he has been a member of The Civic Platform. In 2009-2010, he served as spokesman for the Parliamentary Club of The Civic Platform.

Starting in May 2010, he is the Chairman of the Civic Platform in Mazovia, and in October same year he became member of the national authorities of the Civic Platform.

In January 10th, 2007 was sworn in as a Member of Parliament in the 5th term of Sejm on behalf of the Civic Platform. In the parliamentary elections of 2007, he was elected to a second term by parliamentary mandate. In 2009-2010 he served as the Chairman of the Foreign Affairs Committee.

In the parliamentary elections of 2011, he was elected once again with 40 000 votes. Mr. Halicki is the Chairman of Constitutional Accountability Committee and the member of Foreign Affairs Committee.

In January 2012, Mr. Halicki has become vice president of Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe (PACE).

His passion is travel and sport. For over 40 years he has been a faithful fan of football team Legia Warsaw. In addition, he and his wife are breeders of Great Danes. The dogs are an important part of his family.
